She has lent me an Old Vincent Bible, but it is too faded to read much with the naked eye. I am wondering about infra-red rays.

Leonie had her 82nd birthday yesterday. So she has now started in her 83rd year. Wilner has been changed from morale officer to a staff place, - "Plans & Training" I believe is his assignment. Sarah was here to-day and says that Dick Kelly is being moved out, destination not stated.
