1771 Deed

Brunswick County, Deed Book 10, 1770-1773, pp. 204-208

150 acres in Meherrin Parish in Brunswick County on the south side of Fountain Creek

From: Robert Howard and his wife Sarah & John Vinson of Brunswick County in Meherrin Parish

To: Joseph Vinson

The land was devised to Moses Vinson in the Will of John Vinson, grandfather to Joseph Vinson. The will is recorded in Prince George County

The land was sold by Moses Vinson to John Vinson, uncle of Joseph Vinson
The deed is recorded in Brunswick County.

The land was conveyed to Jeremiah Brown by a deed from John Vinson, uncle to Joseph Vinson and Thomas Vinson, father to Joseph Vinson.

The land was conveyed to Robert Howard by a deed from Jeremiah Brown.

John Vinson was the uncle of Joseph Vinson
Thomas Vinson was the father of Joseph Vinson
John Vinson was the grandfather of Joseph Vinson

John Vinson of Brunswick County and Meherrin Parish buys land in Johnston County, North Carolina

Aaron relinquishes rights of his father John's land in Johnston County, North Carolina to his brother Drury

Together these records show that John Vinson who died in 1787 was the father of Aaron and Drury and bought land in Johnston County, North Carolina when he was a resident of Brunswick County, Meherrin Parish, Virginia.

John who died in 1787 was the son of John who died in 1727 with a will recorded in Prince George County, Virginia. He had a brother named Moses who was unborn at the time of his father's will. He had a brother named Thomas and a nephew Joseph who was the son of Thomas. He bought land from Moses that Moses received from his father's will. This land was later sold to Joseph his nephew.
